# OPEN LAND PRESERVATION: A Natural Priority for Upper Macungie

High on the list of Upper Macungie Township's quality-of-life assets is our wealth of open green spaces — rolling farmlands, woodlands, wetlands and recreational fields. With increased population and pressure for development, your UMT Supervisors have made the preservation of open spaces a leading priority for many years. Far more than an aspirational intent, this focus on preserving large expanses of open land is supported by legal ordinance, as well as an ethical obligation to current and future generations of Upper Macungie residents.

## **Balancing Progress with Preservation**

Back in 2003, your Township leaders enacted the Conservation by Design Ordinance, an enforceable mandate requiring future development to be balanced with considerations for open space and environmental stability. This ordinance was enacted to:

- Preserve forested areas and farmland
- Avoid severe soil erosion and sedimentation
- Encourage development in areas that are more physically suited to the purpose
- Avoid construction on steep slopes
- Preserve significant land areas as conservation areas
- Provide additional active and passive recreation areas and access to open space

Since its enactment, UMT has been able to preserve approximately 323 acres of land (156 acres of farm land and 167 acres of open space), and this legacy is growing. The proposed Lehigh Hills Development will add an additional 105 acres, bringing the total to 428 acres of open space made possible by UMT's Conservation by Design Ordinance. These expanses are Township-owned and are scheduled to be placed in protective Agricultural Conservation Easements.

#### Additional Tools Used to Preserve Land

Along with the Conservation by Design Ordinance, UMT leadership is utilizing the **Agricultural** Conservation Easements Program, Agriculture Security Areas, and the Open Space Preservation Fund as methods to preserve farmland.

The Agricultural Conservation Easements
Program, from the U.S. Department of Agriculture
(USDA), provides financial and technical assistance
to help conserve agricultural lands and wetlands.
In our case, the USDA teamed with Township
government to protect working farmlands and
limit non-agricultural uses of the land.

Currently, Upper Macungie Township has 12 farms with a total of 932 acres permanently preserved in Agricultural Conservation Easements. We are on track to preserve 1,089 acres of farmland through this program by 2021. According to the USDA website, this federal initiative has resulted in improved soil health, water and air quality and wildlife habitat.

## **SENIOR CITIZEN DISCOUNT**

The Township is offering a \$30 senior citizen discount for trash and recycling pick up for anyone over 65 with proof of age (e.g. driver's license). You must own and live at your residence. If you are 65 or turn 65 by December 31, 2019, please apply at the Township municipal building and register by December 31, 2019 for senior citizen discount for 2020. (You only need to apply once.)



Agriculture Security Areas (ASAs) are farms entitled to special protection from condemnation, laws and ordinances that would unreasonably restrict farming operations. Local governments in Pennsylvania may establish ASAs but only in response to petitions from landowners interested in enrolling their land in an ASA. UMT has many acres preserved in ASA, which are color-coded in the map below. This acreage number is always changing.

Additionally, in 2017 UMT created the Open Space Preservation Fund to purchase farmland and/or to subsidize land owners who wish to permanently preserve their agricultural lands. This Fund was started using funds received through a right-of-way easement purchased by PPL, and no UMT tax dollars were spent. It currently has a balance of \$404,444 and every dollar will be dedicated to sustaining the farming legacy and lands that have been so much a part of our community heritage here in Upper Macungie Township.

#### Comparison of Preserved Farmland by Municipality

Yes, Upper Macungie Township is a very desirable place for families and commerce to thrive. And, yes, we are home to


modern interstate transportation infrastructure, a Fortune 500 corporation (Air Products) and countless additional employers and businesses of all sizes and structures. But because of our determination to preserve open spaces through programs like the USDA Agricultural Conservation Easement Program, your Township compares quite favorably with our neighboring municipalities.

Of the contiguous municipalities in UMT's population range, our community compares well in acres preserved through the USDA Agricultural Conservation Easement Program, according to the following statistics from the Lehigh County Agricultural Land Preservation Department. (See chart below.)

Using these 4 preservation tools, Upper Macungie Township is on track to accomplish its mission of preserving as much open space as possible.

# UMT Named One of 100 Safest Cities In America

Upper Macungie Township has been recognized as one of the safest cities in the nation, according to a recent report by Safewise, a national security service provider. The rankings are based on FBI crime statistics and other criteria.

In the **100 Safest Cities in America** 2019 report, issued March 6, UMT ranked 31st and was #1 among all 10 Pennsylvania cities that made the top 100. Eighteen states were represented in the report.

According to the Safewise report: "Overall, the safest cities boast an average violent crime rate of 0.20% incidents per 1,000 people compared to the national average of 4.49%." For the entire report, visit www.safewise.com.



# On-Lot Sewage Management Update

# Sewage System Inspections Mandatory in 2019 for District 1 Properties

This is a program to monitor the proper function of UMT owners' on-lot sewage systems to protect our water table and overall environment. It is a staged program which is mandated by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection and implemented by municipalities.

This ordinance provides a staged program by dividing the Township into three districts.

- In early February, **District 1** property owners received a letter, form, and District map as a reminder to have their septic systems cleaned and inspected by a *registered* Pumper/Hauler before December 31, 2019.
- In 2020, **District 2** will receive the same reminder letter.

Scheduled maintenance of on-lot septic systems helps reduce high costs incurred by property owners should their septic system fail, but ultimately protects and maintains a healthy environment for future generations.

#### KEY SIGNS OF A FAILING SEPTIC SYSTEM

- Issues in the HOUSE
- Backup of sewage in your drains or toilets.
- Decreased flushing of your toilets.
- Decreased drain flow from showers and sinks.
- Unpleasant odors in your home.

#### Issues with your TANK

- Over-flowing or near over-flowing septic tank.
- High solids accumulation in the septic tank.

# **Updated UMT Comprehensive Plan:** First Draft Delivered

Over the past year, the Upper Macungie Township Planning Commission and an appointed Steering Committee have been working with JMT Engineering and Township Staff to develop an update to the Upper Macungie Township Comprehensive Plan.

JMT delivered the first draft of this update at a Public Meeting held on December 13, 2018. The focus was on plan revisions and public input received through surveys and during the Community Visioning Workshop.

Upon completion of the Final Draft, the plan will be forwarded to the Planning Commission, Steering Committee, Lehigh Valley Planning Commission (LVPC) and neighboring municipalities. We anticipate a final public meeting in early April and a formal Planning Commission review at their April 17th meeting.

Finally, the Plan would require a Public Hearing by the Board of Supervisors and a consistency review by the LVPC prior to adoption by the Board.

## Upper Macungie's Third "Destination Winery" Coming to Breinigsville Area

## Independent Park sold to Kempton Winery owner

With a third major winery soon coming to Upper Macungie, our community continues to barrel ahead as a "must-visit destination" for wine lovers throughout the region.

In January 2019, the Township sold the 25-acre Independent Park property to Stony Run winery for \$1,526,000, a price above the asking bid. Stony Run now joins two wellestablished winemakers — Clover Hill Vineyards & Winery and Vynecrest Vineyard & Winery — in the rolling hills of Breinigsville.

Independent Park was originally purchased by the Township with the intent of renovation into a Community Center. It became better suited as an event rental facility, which was rented quite often on weekends, but still could not create the revenue to justify keeping the facility, especially with plans of constructing a true Community Center at Grange Park.

The Township is very satisfied not only with the purchase price, but with the type of facility opening, and the decision of the winery to honor all of the events already booked at the facility. Stony Run Winery plans to plant vineyards and have a wine-tasting facility they will use for their own events as well as rent out for events and parties by late spring.

We toast all of the Upper Macungie destination wineries, and invite residents to learn more about these wineries so close to home; Clover Hill, Vynecrest, and now Stony Run!

# **Spotted Lanternfly**

#### **IT'S SPRING TIME!**

In Pennsylvania, the first nymphs of Spotted Lanternfly hatch in late April to early May. The wingless nymphs develop through four stages.

Before that happens, NOW is the time when you can contribute to prevent its infestation by scraping egg masses off into a bag of rubbing alcohol or spraying them with dormant oil. Just be careful not to move egg masses into uninfested areas.

Female lanternflies lay eggs not only on trees, but also on stones and man-made surfaces, so don't forget to check your cars, trash cans and outdoor furniture, etc.

The 2019 Junior Emergency Services Academy will be conducted:





## RECYCLING & TRASH PICK UP GUIDELINES (www.uppermac.org/recycling)

## YARD WASTE COLLECTION

For your convenience, Upper Macungie Township provides property owners with the means to properly dispose of their leaves and yard waste. There will be a 1-day only, curbside pick up of YARD WASTE. After that, yard waste may be deposited at the UMT Yard Waste Drop-off Site.

#### YARD WASTE CURBSIDE PICK UP

#### Wednesday, May 8, 2019

WHAT: Leaves from trees, bushes and other plants, shrubbery clippings and tree trimmings. (For maximum size, see "HOW TO PREPARE" below.)

WHAT NOT: No grass clippings, roots from trees or shrubs, or lumber. Improper bags, bundles or materials will go uncollected and tagged to notify residents of reasons why materials were not accepted.

HOW TO PREPARE: Yard waste must be placed in commercially-designed open trash containers (with sloped sides) no larger than 32-gallon capacity with a loaded weight of less than 60 lbs. each. Smaller limbs and branches must be tied and properly bundled to a maximum size of 48" × 18" × 18" with a maximum weight of 60 lbs. If branches and limbs are not tied and bundled, they will not be picked up. Ties for bundles must be made of biodegradable materials.

All containers must be out the night before after 7 p.m.

**HOW MUCH:** Combined maximum of 6 containers will be collected.

**PLEASE NOTE** – The service is **one day delayed** when a holiday below falls on your pick up day:

Please place your trash cart out for collection the night before your pick-up day at curb or grass area several feet away from the mailbox, landscaping, or telephone poles. It should **not be placed on the street**. Your recycle cart can be placed several feet from the trash cart. As a reminder, any trash or recyclables placed outside your UMT carts will **NOT** be collected.

You can purchase one additional UMT trash cart and extra recycling carts. See **www.uppermac.org/refuse** for costs. There is no extra trash pick-up fee.

WASTE MANAGEMENT is the service provider to handle refuse and recycling collection in Upper Macungie Township. Refuse and recycling pick up is on a weekly basis. New residents: you must come into the Township building to fill out a moving permit. You will then be informed of the delivery date of your trash cart (for new construction only), and your zone and day for trash pick up.

## **BMP Maintenance and Inspection**

Stormwater has become increasingly regulated over the last decade in an effort to better protect our streams, lakes and drinking water supply. Control of stormwater runoff is accomplished in many ways commonly known as a **Best Management Practice (BMP)**. A BMP may be something that is designed, such as a detention basin, or a practice such as street sweeping. The goal of any BMP is to reduce the amount and speed of runoff from a rainstorm as well as reducing the pollution that is carried in the runoff, such as sediment, fertilizers, pesticides, pet waste and other contaminants.

If your home was built after 2010, it may contain a BMP. The builder or developer would have recorded the details about any BMP with your property's deed. The deed will identify the BMP and who is responsible for the long-term operation and maintenance. This is a legal requirement that runs with the property and you, as the homeowner, are responsible for knowing what BMPs are located on your property.

If you are not the first homeowner and did not receive the maintenance plan at the time of purchase, you may want to check with the Lehigh County Recorder of Deeds. The Township has been compiling a list of properties with BMPs based on our subdivision records, and later this year we will be mailing out information to those homeowners explaining the procedure for maintaining and inspecting your BMP. ## Why Sewer Lateral Inspections are Required

The number one problem with any sewer collection system is INFILTRATION. Infiltration occurs when ground water finds a leak or hole in the sewer system, and, in turn, becomes wastewater headed for the treatment plant.


This artificial load increases our wastewater invoice as we are charged by the gallon from the Lehigh County Authority, and the demand at the wastewater treatment facility.

These artificial loads, at times, cause Allentown to exceed its treatment capacity and require them to activate a bypass to keep the plant from flooding. The entire Lehigh Valley has been under a U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Administrative Order to **reduce infiltration in the entire sewer system**, since the Allentown Waste Water Treatment Plant treats all the flow from the surrounding municipalities.

Our Township is one of the municipalities sending wastewater to the Allentown Plant. The Township sends a video camera through all our main collection piping on a reoccurring basis. However, the Township does not own the sewer lateral.

As part of the Township's commitment to reduce our infiltration contribution, when a home changes ownership we require that the lateral be video-recorded to make sure that it is still intact. The Township has also identified areas where the lateral connections

may have significant leaks. Over the next five years the Township will be using contractors to repair or replace those leaking laterals. The work will be completed within the Township's Right of Way and there will be no cost to the homeowner. All homeowners affected by these projects will be notified in advance.



\*A new cleanout will be installed and the section of the lateral between the mainline sewer and the new cleanout will be replaced.
