Resolution for Municipal Assistance Program (MAP) Grant - Mobile Command Unit - On February 13th there was a joint work session between Upper Macungie Township Board of Supervisors and the South Whitehall Township Board of Commissioners. The purpose of the work session was to discuss partnering and applying for funding for a Mobil Command Unit. There is a Municipal Assistance Program (MAP) grant where some funding for this project could be obtained. A Resolution must be passed to apply for said grant. Upon a motion by Vice-Chairman Ashmar, seconded by Chairman Earley and unanimously approved it is hereby resolved that Upper Macungie Township participates in the joint

PUBLIC WORKS REPORT

Director Faust is with us this evening. Bids for the roof at the Community Center in Independence Park are being received. Vice-Chairman Ashmar asked Director Faust to prepare a list of excess property that could be sold at the upcoming auction.

ZONING REPORT

The report of the Zoning Officer for the month of February was received and showed 43 permits issued, 5 for new residences, 6 for residential additions/alterations, 0 for new commercial/industrial buildings, 14 for commercial/industrial additions/alterations, 18 miscellaneous, plus 10 electrical licenses and 5 plumbing licenses.

In February the Zoning Hearing Board of Adjustment heard the following appeal:

#21302 - The appeal of Daniel D. & Patricia L. Kuhns, 5743 Tilghman St. for a variance to front yard setback to construct an addition to the rear of the former Gulf Automobile Service Station building. The property is located at 5204 Tilghman Street and is zoned Highway Commercial. The building is currently nonconforming with respect to front yard setback along Oak View Drive. A variance was granted to expend the existing non-conforming structure within the front yard setback on February 13th, 2013.

#21303 - The appeal of Richard Koze/Kay Builders,5930 Hamilton Boulevard, Suite210, Wescosville for a variance to maximum building height for a Personal Care facility. The applicant is proposing 40 feet 7 inches which exceeds the maximum building height requirement of 35 feet. The property is located at southeast corner of Blue Barn Road & Oak View Drive and is zoned NC. The variance request was changed to permit a building height of 38'6" at the public hearing. A variance was granted on February 27th, 2013.

UPPER MACUNGIE TOWNSHIP BOARD OF AUDITORS

The report was read into the record by Chairman Earley.

- 1. The 2013 wage/holiday/vacation/benefit/bereavement schedule and policy for Township Supervisors follows:
- a. The base rate will remain at the prior year's rate for full or part time working Supervisors.
 Standard Township-issued payroll time sheets are to be used by all and archived with other records.
- b. Mileage allowance is to be consistent with that granted to non-elected officials for personal vehicles used while conducting township business. It is assumed that liability insurance for any eventuality is in place and coverage is equivalent to that carried for township owned vehicles.
- c. Provision for employees serving jury duty township to supplement remuneration up to usual wage level. Proof of service may be required.
 - d. Paid holidays schedule is identical to that for all township employees.
 - e. Vacation span and terms are the same as that of all township employees
- f. Bereavement policy is the same as that of all township employees, except township police, who operate under different guidelines.
- g. Supervisors and employees are covered by existing life and disability and medical insurance, and reimbursement policy for medical expenses is the same for supervisors and employees. Supervisors participating in township health insurance plan are to pay same percentage of premium that employees are paying.
- h. Sick and personal leave policy is recommended that three days non-cumulative sick leave be allowed without a doctor's excuse, while the two personal days be taken at employee's discretion, but preferably not before or after a holiday.
 - i. Retirement benefits, i.e. pension and '457' plan, are to be continued as in previous years.
- 2. The supervisors are commended for the responsible and considerate approach to making difficult decisions in this era of complicated choices among many issues.
- 3. The auditors urge that a transition plan be evaluated to make the hiring of a township manager a reality.
