BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

The monthly meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Upper Macungie Township was held on August 3, 2017, 7:00 PM, in the Municipal Building, 8330 Schantz Road, Breinigsville, PA 18031. Those present were Chairman, James M. Brunell; Vice-Chairman, John P. "Sean" Gill; Supervisor, Kathy A. Rader; Township Manager, Daniel P. Olpere; Sewer & Refuse Director/Assistant Township Manager, Robert Ibach; Township Engineer, J. Scott Stenroos; Keystone Consulting Engineer, David Alban; Director of Community Development, Daren Martocci; Solicitor, Andrew V. Schantz, Esq.; Township Secretary, Ashley Godshall; Finance Director, Bruce Koller; and Chief Edgardo Colón of the UMT Police Department.

Chairman James M. Brunell opened the meeting and asked all present to join him in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag of the United States of America. He also thanked Chief Colón for the UMTPD efforts regarding National Night Out.

<u>MINUTES</u> - Chairman Brunell stated the minutes of the previous meeting of July 6, 2017 would not be read unless there was some objection. **Upon a motion by Chairman Brunell, seconded by Supervisor Rader and unanimous, it was agreed to waive the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting and approve the minutes as presented.**

DISCUSSIONS & UPDATES

1234 Avocet Drive Drainage Issue – After Director Martocci provided an update on the long-term drainage issues at the property at 1234 Avocet Drive and surrounding neighborhood, Chairman Brunell made a motion, seconded by Supervisor Rader and unanimous, to authorize Director Martocci to move forward with a topographic survey and, if the study proves improvements would be viable, draft potential design options to rectify the issue.

Parkland Fields Schantz Road Construction Update – The roadwork should be completed by August 31, 2017, with the exception of the wearing course, which will be delayed due to a minor issue with the pipeline.

Offer to Purchase Oldt Road Property Update – Chairman Brunell announced the \$3 million offer the Township made to purchase the Oldt Road property from the Jaindl Land Company was turned down, and he encouraged the public to attend further meetings as the property moves through the land development process.

Public Comment

James Caffrey (318 McBride Ln) – wants the Township to further negotiate the property purchase with Jaindl Land Company.

After some discussion, Chairman Brunell made a motion, seconded by VC Gill and unanimous, to allow Township Manager Ibach to enter into an agreement with Integra Realty Resources for appraisal services for the Route 100 Quadrant Road Project for an amount not to exceed \$4,500.

Treasurer's Report – July: Total bills from all funds – \$1,681,955.09. Total transfers – none. A motion was made by Chairman Brunell, seconded by VC Gill and unanimous, to pay the July bills.

Recreation Board Report – VC Gill: There are 40 people currently registered for the Tennis. Further details in the July Recreation Board Report.

Planning & Zoning Report – Daren Martocci: During the month of July, 91 permits were issued (Commercial – 25; Residential – 48; and Zoning Permits – 18); 4 Plumbing Licenses, and 8 Electric Licenses. Further details in the July Planning & Zoning Report.

At the recommendation of Director Martocci, Chairman Brunell made a motion, seconded by VC Gill and unanimous, to schedule a Conditional Use Hearing for UMT Docket #2124 Heather Glen Commercial Development for Thursday, September 7, 2017 at 6:30pm, preceding the regularly scheduled Board of Supervisors Meeting.

Director Martocci gave a brief update regarding several drainage issues within the Township. The Township is currently working closely with Lehigh County Conservation District (LCCD) to abate some of the issues arising from certain land development. For example, a basin owned by Kay Builders is currently in violation of Chapter 102 of the Clean Streams Act and LCCD will be responsible for enforcing the violation.

Public Comment

Jim Wrisley (Newtown Rd) — wants to make the Board aware that Grim Orchards is currently also in violation of the same Act and believes issues will occur on his property if Mr. Grim's parking lot project is allowed to proceed.

Upper Macungie Township Police (UMTPD) Report – Chief Colón: UMT has had a small reduction in the number of crashes. The Good Neighbor Coalition will be working with Liberty Property Trust to make some potential adjustments in traffic patterns which may result in safer traffic conditions in the area. A very successful National Night Out was held on August 1st at Lone Lane Park. The recent Accreditation of UMTPD is an honorable milestone that will prove very beneficial for the Department and the Township. Further details in the July UMTPD Report.

- FAIR DISTRICTS PA
 - Carla Colangelo (5535 Kurt Dr) Fair Districts PA would like the Board to consider the
 "fair districts" and gerrymandering issue a local issue and not a state issue by
 adopting resolution that addresses said issue.
 - Virginia Vidoni (1736 Central Park) refuted the Chairman's stated opinion that a more detailed plan needs to be in place for action to occur.

- o Mary Erdman (5533 Heather Ln) stated there is objective data which rates PA low in the way the political boundaries are drawn. Districts are currently being drawn based on voter demographics and not physical boundaries. She provided the Board with a list of Republican PA Politicians who are in favor of this legislation.
- Deb Martin (1833 Kay Dr) says urgency is required because the process for this change is lengthy.
- Jennifer Benson (8346 Pheasant Run Rd) expressed her support for a Fair Districts Resolution.

After much discussion, Supervisor Rader made a motion, seconded by VC Gill, to further research the Fair Districts PA issue and have another discussion at next month's Board of Supervisors meeting. The motion passed with Supervisor Rader and VC Gill in favor and Chairman Brunell against.

- Tony Caciolo (Monogram Pools) presented an update of his progress with the tree conservation/pool installation issue for Janice and Greg Stout and asked the Board to again consider allowing the installation of the pool. After much discussion, no action was taken.
 - o Peg Konnick (10543 Schantz Rd) does not believe the Board should grant the request.

There being no other business, upon a motion by Chairman Brunell, seconded by VC Gill and unanimous, the meeting is adjourned at 9:16 PM.
