BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

The monthly meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Upper Macungie Township was held on March 1, 2018, 7:00 PM, in the Municipal Building, 8330 Schantz Road, Breinigsville, PA 18031. Those present were Chairman, James M. Brunell; Vice-Chairman, John P. "Sean" Gill; Supervisor, Kathy A. Rader; Township Engineer, J. Scott Stenroos; Director of Community Development, Daren Martocci; Solicitor, Andrew V. Schantz, Esq.; Township Manager, Robert R. Ibach; Township Secretary, Ashley Godshall; Bureau of Fire Director, Grant Grim; Director of Public Works, Scott Faust; Finance Director, Bruce Koller; and Deputy Chief Joseph Wilson of the UMTPD.

Chairman James M. Brunell opened the meeting and asked all present to join him in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag of the United States of America.

<u>MINUTES</u> - Chairman Brunell stated the minutes of the previous meetings of February 1, 2018 and February 8, 2018 would not be read unless there was some objection. **Upon a motion by Chairman Brunell, seconded by VC Gill and unanimous, it was agreed to waive the reading of the minutes of the previous meetings and approve the minutes as presented.**

2017 UMT Financial Report – Director Koller presented the 2017 Year End Budget Summary Review for the General Fund, highlighting the difference between actual revenue versus budgeted revenue at \$2,443,884 above budget and the difference between total expenses versus budgeted expenses at \$1,223,078 below budget.

MOTIONS

Parkland School District Riparian Buffer – At the recommendation of Engineer Stenroos, Supervisor Rader made a motion, seconded by Chairman Brunell and unanimous to allow Parkland School District to plant a riparian buffer per Lehigh County Conservation District (LCCD) requirements on the property located between Brookdale Road and Butz Road having Pin #545474852604-1, in area along the Breinig Run as determined by UMT Public Works.

Chairman Brunell made a motion, seconded by Supervisor Rader and unanimous, to execute the LCCD Agreement regarding the Buffer after it is reviewed and approved by Solicitor Schantz.

Parkland School District Road Improvements Agreements – At the recommendation of Solicitor Schantz, Chairman Brunell made a motion, seconded by VC Gill and unanimous, to authorize the signing of an agreement to separate the Parkland School District Project from the Schantz Road Improvements Project

Authorize Meeting Room Upgrades – At the recommendation of Manager Ibach, Supervisor Rader made a motion, seconded by VC Gil and unanimous, to award the Entertainment Service Group, Inc. proposals for upgrading the video display system in the public meeting room in the amount of \$11,810.66; audio system upgrades in the amount of \$9,778.88; and small conference room in the amount of \$2,671.50, for total cost of \$24,261.04.

Authorize Agreement with Howard Kulp Architects, PC for Recreation Center – At the recommendation of Manager Ibach, Chairman Brunell made a motion, seconded by VC Gill and unanimous, to award a professional services agreement to Howard Kulp Architects, PC in the amount of \$418,775 for architectural, structural, and MPE/FP engineering services all the way through to bidding for the proposed recreation center.

Authorize Agreement with Keystone Consulting Engineers, Inc. for Recreation Center – At the recommendation of Manager Ibach, Supervisor Rader made a motion, seconded by VC Gill and unanimous, to award a professional services agreement to Keystone Consulting Engineers in the amount of \$211,850.00 for civil engineering services for the proposed recreation center to also include the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit application.

Authorize Purchase of Recycling Carts – At the recommendation of Manager Ibach, Chairman Brunell made a motion, seconded by Supervisor Rader and unanimous, to authorize the purchase of 7,200 (35) gallon recycling carts purchased from Rehrig Pacific Company in the amount of \$286,272.00.

Authorize Gate and Driveway Installation at North Quarry Training Facility – At the recommendation of Director Faust, Chairman Brunell made a motion, seconded by Supervisor Rader and unanimous, to authorize the Public Works Department to install new gate and stone driveway for the North Quarry for accessing the fire companies' training area.

LANTA Bus on Nursery Street – Supervisor Rader has received several complaints from residents regarding the LANTA bus route on Nursery Street. Supervisor Rader made a motion, seconded by Chairman Brunell and unanimous, to have Solicitor Schantz draft a formal letter to LANTA requesting a review and revision to its bus route on Nursery Street. After further discussion, the motion was rescinded. No formal action was taken at this time.

REPORTS

Treasurer's Report – February: Total bills from all funds – \$1,393,976.35. Total transfers – \$0.00. A motion was made by Chairman Brunell, seconded by VC Gill and unanimous, to pay the February bills, totaling \$1,393,976.35.

Recreation Board Report: Bret Spangler from the Recreation Board reported there has been a lot of discussion about a Grange Park Farmers Market. Both Friends of Upper Macungie Township Parks and Recreation and the Recreation Board have vacancies and are in need of volunteers. Further details in the February Recreation Board Report.

Community Development Report – Daren Martocci: During the month of February, 64 permits were issued; 8 Plumbing Licenses; and 14 Electric Licenses. The next public work session for the Comprehensive Plan Steering Committee will be held on Thursday, March 8th at 7:00pm. *Further details in the February Community Development Report.*

Township Engineer's Report – Scott Stenroos: Engineer Stenroos provided an update on the status of the several engineering issues, including an update on the Route 100 Quadrant Project (QRP), no parking on Ruppsville Road, Nestle Way timing issue, Schantz Road and Route 100 timing issue, and truck signage concerns.
