Resolution 2018-23 – Sunset Drive Adoption – RESOLUTION OF THE UPPER MACUNGIE TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS ACCEPTING ADDITIONAL LANDS FOR ROADWAY RIGHTS OF WAY KNOWN AS SUNSET DRIVE IN THE PARKLAND FIELDS SUBDIVISION AS PART OF THE PUBLIC HIGHWAY SYSTEM OF THE TOWNSHIP OF UPPER MACUNGIE, LEHIGH COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA. At the recommendation of Solicitor Schantz and upon a motion by Chairman Brunell, and seconded by VC Gill and unanimous, BE IT RESOLVED, Resolution #2018-23 is hereby approved.

Resolution 2018-24 – Signal at Twin Ponds/Schantz Road – RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS TO APPLY FOR A PERMIT TO INSTALL A NEW TRAFFIC SIGNAL AT THE INTERSECTION OF SR 3012 (SCHANTZ ROAD) AND TWIN PONDS ROAD/ARROWHEAD LANE IN UPPER MACUNGIE, LEHIGH COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA. After some discussion and at the recommendation of Solicitor Schantz and upon a motion by Supervisor Rader, seconded by Chairman Brunell and unanimous, BE IT RESOLVED, Resolution #2018-24 is hereby approved.

Authorize staff to proceed with Fire Code Ordinance update – At the recommendation of Manager Ibach, Supervisor Rader made a motion, seconded by VC Gill and unanimous to authorize staff to review, prepare and advertise updates to Chapter 7, Part 3 of Upper Macungie Township's Codified Ordinances.

Award 2018 Sanitary Sewer CIPP Lining Bid — At the recommendation of Manager Ibach, Chairman Brunell made a motion, seconded by Supervisor Rader and unanimous to award the 2018 Sanitary Sewer System Rehabilitation Project, Contract "A" for Cured-In-Place Pipe Lining to Insituform Technologies, LLC of Chesterfield MO in the amount of \$145,265.08.

Approve transfer of Funds for Traffic Studies and Improvements – At the recommendation of Manager Ibach, Chairman Brunell made a motion, seconded by VC Gill and unanimous, to approve the transfer of \$165,000.00 from the unappropriated reserve account into account 36.439.314 Traffic Engineering/Legal for expenses related to the Route 100 Quadrant Road Project and to fund research for alternatives to the Quadrant Road Project.

Authorize Ridge Line/Park 100 Boundary Road upgrade fee — At the recommendation of Manager Ibach, Supervisor Rader made a motion, seconded by Chairman Brunell and unanimous, to allocate the Ridgeline/Park 100 Traffic Contribution in the amount of \$200,000.00 into account 36.439.314 Traffic Engineering/Legal for the cost of the adaptive traffic signals project for Route 100.

Authorize contract for Community Center Capital Campaign Fundraising Study — At the recommendation of Manager Ibach, VC Gill made a motion, seconded by Supervisor Rader and unanimous, to authorize the Township Manager to enter into a contract for professional services to Convergent Nonprofit Solutions to conduct a fund-raising feasibility study for the proposed recreation building in an amount of \$24,500.00.

Authorize contract for GEO Technical Services for proposed community center — At the recommendation of Manager Ibach, Supervisor Rader made a motion, seconded by VC Gill and unanimous, to authorize the Township Manager to enter into a contract for professional services to a selected geotechnical engineer for testing, consulting and construction observation of the proposed recreation building site in an amount not to exceed \$13,500.00.

Authorize Splash Park Maintenance Agreement – After some discussion, Supervisor Rader made a motion, seconded by VC Gill and unanimous, to authorize the signing of the Splash Park at Grange Road Park Project Close Out and Maintenance Agreement with Stoneridge Aquatic Construction.

Appoint Richard (Wes) Schlauch to Parks & Recreation Board vacancy — At the recommendation of Manager Ibach, Chairman Brunell made a motion, seconded by VC Gill and unanimous, to appoint Richard (Wes) Schlauch to fill a vacancy created by the resignation of Jennifer Szukics on the Parks and Recreation Board.

Jane Brown (306 Sawgrass Dr) — is concerned about who is responsible for grass cutting along Schantz Road near Charles Drive. She and her neighbors have been cutting the grass for the past 5 years and feels it is dangerous due to the traffic and the gully. Solicitor Schantz and Director Martucci will investigate and report back to J. Brown and resident Yuze Shang (330 Sawgrass Dr).

Martin Hetrick (294 Sawgrass Dr) – wants fire hydrant location flags to mark 3 on Sawgrass Drive and 2 on Royal Fern Rd. Lehigh County Authority (LCA) is responsible for marking hydrants, so Director Grim will contact LCA. M. Hetrick's other concern is a speed limit sign on Sawgrass Rd is 6 feet from the intersection and is not noticeable. Director Faust will check into moving it. A discussion ensued about the traffic at Krocks Road and Cetronia Road intersection and having a traffic signal. Chairman Brunell asked the Township engineer and Township staff to update the history of the intersection and to report at next month's meeting regarding the installation of a traffic signal.
