ORDINANCES

Adopt Ordinance 2018-05 Fire Code Amendment — AN ORDINANCE OF THE UPPER MACUNGIE TOWNSHIP ADOPTING PORTIONS OF THE 2009 EDITION OF THE INTERNATIONAL FIRE CODE TO SERVE AS THE UPPER MACUNGIE TOWNSHIP FIRE PREVENTION CODE, REGULATING AND GOVERNING THE SAFEGUARDING OF LIFE AND PROPERTY FROM THE FIRE AND EXPLOSION HAZARDS ARISING FROM THE STORAGE, HANDLING AND USE OF HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES, MATERIALS AND DEVICES, AND FROM CONDITIONS HAZARDOUS TO LIFE OR PROPERTY IN THE OCCUPANCY OF BUILDINGS AND PREMISES IN THE UPPER MACUNGIE TOWNSHIP; PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF PERMITS AND COLLECTION OF FEES; REPEALING CERTAIN PORTIONS OF UPPER MACUNGIE TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE NO. 2008-02 AND ALL OTHER ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF THE ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH. At the recommendation of Manager Ibach and Administrator

Dellecker, Chairman Brunell made a motion, seconded by VC Gill and unanimous, to adopt Ordinance 2018-05, portions of the 2009 International Fire Code to serve as the Upper Macungie Township Fire Prevention Code.

Adopt Ordinance 2018-06 Truck Restrictions – Breinigsville Rd – AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF UPPER MACUNGIE, LEHIGH COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING CHAPTER 15 (MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC), PART 2 (TRAFFIC REGULATIONS) OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF UPPER MACUNGIE PROHIBITING TRUCK TRAFFIC ON CERTAIN STREETS LOCATED WITHIN UPPER MACUNGIE TOWNSHIP; SAID REQUIREMENTS BEING SET FORTH MORE FULLY IN THE BODY OF THIS ORDINANCE. At the recommendation of Engineer Alban, Chairman Brunell made a motion, seconded by Supervisor Rader and unanimous, to adopt Ordinance 2018-06, amending Chapter 15 (motor vehicles and traffic), Part 2 (Traffic Regulations) to prohibit truck traffic on "NEW" Breinigsville Road (T-858) - southbound between SR 222 and Butz Road (SR 3007) located within Upper Macungie Township.

Adopt Ordinance 2018-07 Park Rules — AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF UPPER MACUNGIE, LEHIGH COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA ESTABLISHING AND ADOPTING RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR TOWNSHIP OWNED RECREATION PARKS AND FACILITIES AND ESTABLISHING FINES FOR VIOLATIONS OF SAID RULES. At the recommendation of Manager Ibach, Supervisor Rader made a motion, seconded by VC Gill and unanimous, to adopt Ordinance 2018-07, to re-establish Park Rules of Use for Upper Macungie Township Park and Recreation facilities.

Resolution 2018-26 – Docket #2173 Lehigh Valley West Industrial Park, Lots 5, & 7-11, Preliminary Land Development Plan — RESOLUTION GRANTING CONDITIONAL PRELIMINARY LAND DEVELOPMENT APPROVAL FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A 384,500 SQUARE FOOT WAREHOUSE AS WELL AS INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS REQUIRED TO SERVE THE FACILITY, INCLUDING ROADWAY IMPROVEMENTS, PUBLIC WATER AND SANITARY SEWER, AND STORMWATER MANAGEMENT FACILITIES PROPOSED ON CERTAIN EXISTING LOTS CONSOLDIATED TO SERVE THE PROJECT LOCATED AT THE INTERSECTION OF OLDT ROAD AND NESTLE WAY IN UPPER MACUNGIE TOWNSHIP, PENNSYLVANIA. At the recommendation of Engineer Alban and Solicitor Schantz and upon a motion by Chairman Brunell, seconded by Supervisor Rader and unanimous, BE IT RESOLVED, Resolution #2018-26 is hereby approved.*

*Chairman Brunell made an additional motion, seconded by VC Gill and unanimous, granting Waivers #1, 2, 4, and 5 as outlined in Keystone Consulting Engineers, Inc. letter dated June 18, 2018 regarding the approved Lehigh Valley West Industrial Park plans.

Public Comment:

James Caffrey (318 McBride Ln) – respectfully requested that the Township again try to negotiate to purchase lots from Jaindl for open space. Supervisor Rader commented that the Township made an attempt to purchase, however, we could not come to terms due to a substantial difference in price.

Michael Lansbury (NFI Realtor) – commented that there will be open space, including Lot 11, which is virtually undeveloped. Lot 5 will remain open for use as a storm water management area. Also, at this stage of the planning process, selling lots back to the Township is not a viable option.

Resolution 2018-27 – Twp. At the recommendation of Manager Ibach and upon a motion by Chairman Brunell, seconded by VC Gill and unanimous, BE IT RESOLVED, Resolution #2018-27 is hereby approved.

Appoint Michael Werst to fill Planning Commission vacancy (replacing P. Sunny Ghai whose term expires the end of 2020) — At the recommendation of Manager Ibach, Chairman Brunell made a motion, seconded by Supervisor Rader and unanimous to appoint Mr. Michael Werst to the Planning Commission to fill the open position created by the resignation of Sunny Ghai in June of 2018. Mr. Ghai's term expires in December of 2020.

Award 2018 Manhole Rehabilitation Bid — At the recommendation of Manager Ibach, Supervisor Rader made a motion, seconded by VC Gill and unanimous to award the 2018 Manhole Rehabilitation Project Contract "A" for Upper Macungie Township in the amount of \$126,065.00 to the PIM Corporation.

Authorize Township Manager to sign LCA Letter – At the recommendation of Manager Ibach, Chairman Brunell made a motion, seconded by VC Gill and unanimous, to allow the Township Manager to sign a letter of cooperation and collaboration with the Lehigh County Authority and the City of Allentown relating to the USEPA's Administrative Order.

Proceed with purchase of Pump Station Analyzers (2) – At the recommendation of Manager Ibach, Supervisor Rader made a motion, seconded by VC Gill and unanimous, to purchase two (2) sewer pump station analyzers in the amount of \$9,425.36 from Hartco Environmental.

Approve Park and Recreation Board By-laws — At the recommendation of Manager Ibach, VC Gill made a motion, seconded by Supervisor Rader and unanimous, to Approve Park and Recreation Board By-laws.

Approve Park and Recreation Photo Scavenger Hunt program — At the recommendation of Parks and Recreation Board President, Katie Shade, Supervisor Rader made a motion, seconded by VC Gill and unanimous, to approve a new Recreation program, the Photo Scavenger Hunt.

Award 2003 CAT 924G Loader – At the recommendation of Director Faust, Chairman Brunell made a motion, seconded by VC Gill and unanimous, to ratify the sale of the 2003 CAT 924G Loader to Jerry Johnson in the amount of \$53,433.00.

Treasurer's Report – Bruce Koller: Director Koller reported that **June's** total bills from all funds – \$1,375.151.01. Total transfers – \$0.00. A motion was made by Chairman Brunell, seconded by VC Gill and unanimous, to pay the June bills.

Recreation Board Report –Katie Shade: Parks and Recreation Board President Shade reported that there were 4 applicants for the 2 Board vacancy spots and they will bring their recommendations for appointment to the August Supervisors' meeting. The Splash Park is open and Katie also mentioned the many upcoming programs and events including "Movies in the Park" and "Lemonade in the Park". More details in the June Recreation Board Report.

Charles Deprill (5421 Chapmans Rd): Concerned that people without key cards are being let into the Splash Park by people who have the passes. The Township will monitor on a random basis.

Community Development Report – **Duane Dellecker**: Administrator Dellecker reported that during the month of June, 148 permits were issued; 3 Plumbing Licenses; and 8 Electric Licenses. There will be a Zoning Appeal Hearing of Allentown SMSA d/b/a Verizon Wireless at the Township Building on July 11, 2018. Further details in the June Community Development Report.

James Caffrey (318 McBride Ln) – wanted an update about who is responsible for grass cutting along Schantz Road. Solicitor Schantz explained that until the road is accepted, the Developer is responsible and after acceptance, the resident is responsible. Mr. Caffrey wondered if a resident can choose not to mow. That could be possible, although the resident would still be subject to the zoning regulations.

Bret Spangler (1117 Covered Bridge Crossing) – wanted to verify that streets can be closed for block parties. Director Faust said yes, as long as he is notified, and Supervisor Rader added that barricades need to be moveable and have a pathway through the area to allow emergency vehicles access.

There being no other business, upon a motion by Chairman Brunell, seconded by VC Gill and unanimous, the meeting is adjourned at 8:26 PM.
