§ 21-201. Definitions. [Ord. No. 2019-19,¹ 11/7/2019]

As used in this Part, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

DUMPSTER — A metal storage receptacle used to temporarily store debris or garbage which is then emptied of its contents or removed with its contents by a truck specially equipped for this purpose.

PERSON — Any natural person, partnership, firm, association, utility, or corporation.

PORTABLE STORAGE DEVICE — Any portable structure, not self-propelled, designed to store personal belongings, whether constructed of flexible or inflexible material, including but not limited to, containers commonly known as "portable storage devices" or "PODS[®]."

STREET — The entire right-of-way of a public street, highway, or road within the geographical limits of the Township, but shall not include any state-designated highway over which the Department of Transportation of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania has jurisdiction.

UNIT — A dumpster or portable storage device.
