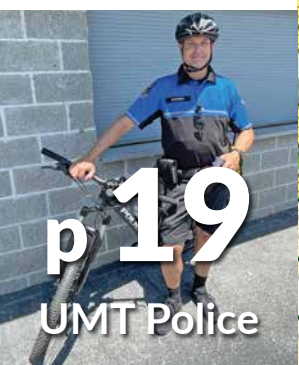

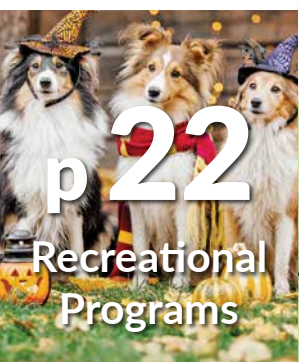

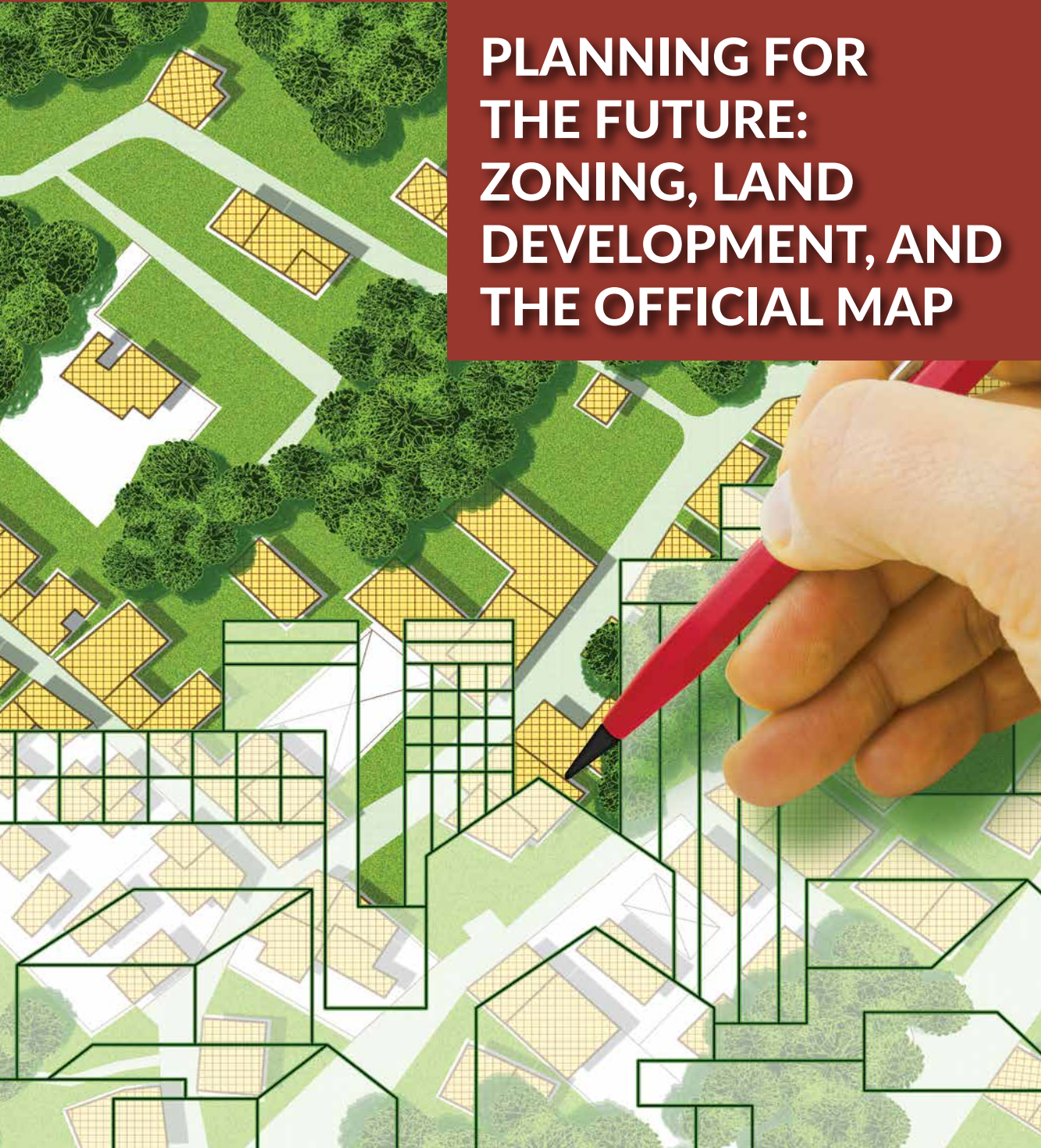

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GRANGE ROAD PARK STORMWATER FACILITIES WALKING TOUR



Come take a walk at Grange Road Park and use the Stormwater Facilities walking tour map to view and investigate the multitude of stormwater Best Management Practices or BMPs Upper Macungie has installed over the years in order to collect, treat and manage the stormwater runoff. As you explore, some of the BMPs shown on the map may not be visible during your walk as they are hidden below the surface. As a result of growing and expanding the Park, these BMP's are an integral part of reducing the environmental impact during and after rain events.

Real Estate & School Taxes

The Tax Collector, Tracy Hodrick, collects Upper Macungie Township real estate taxes and Parkland School District school taxes. The Tax Collector does not determine the amount of the tax or the assessment.

Upper Macungie Township real estate tax bills are dated April 1 and cover the calendar year (Jan. – Dec.). The Parkland School District school tax bills are dated July 1 and cover the fiscal year (July – June). Property tax bills are mailed to owners of record for the current year. **If you own property and do not receive a bill you are still obligated to pay the tax.** Inquire about your property by contacting the Tax Collector by phone or email.

The easiest method to pay is by check, money order or cashier's check via the mail or one of the drop boxes located both outside and inside the township building. Should you require a receipt, please include a self-addressed stamped envelope with your payment or come in person during the hours listed on your tax bill. Please send separate checks for school and township. If you have more than one property, please send separate checks for each property. Checks must be made payable to TRACY HODRICK, Tax Collector.

Since the tax office is separate from the other Municipal offices, no other employees of Upper Macungie Township are permitted to take tax payments or provide a paid receipt.

Online Banking: Customers who utilize online banking payments will need to create a separate "Payee" for township and school taxes. Separate payments must be sent for school and township. Customers with more than one property need to send separate payments for each property. The tax bill number or the parcel identification number (PIN) must be included to ensure proper application of payments.

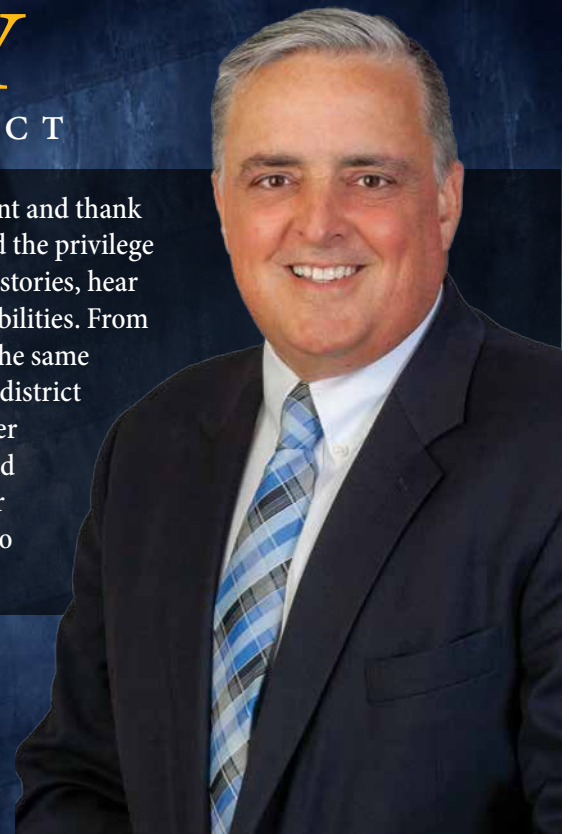
STATE REPRESENTATIVE GARY DAY 187TH LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT

SUMP PUMP AND FLOOR DRAIN INSPECTION PROGRAM UPDATE

In 2020 the Township was to begin a program of home basement inspections to identify and eliminate sources of clear water (rain and groundwater) entering our sanitary sewer system. The affected area included the neighborhoods of Oakland Park, Briarwood, and Holiday Hills; all areas serviced by one of the Township's sanitary sewer pump stations. The program was put on hold during 2020 and 2021 due to COVID-19; later this fall we will be starting the program.

The reason for this inspection program is that during rain events and periods of wet weather there is an excessive amount of clear water that enters the sanitary sewer system. This clear water, along with the normal flow of wastewater, is sent to the City of Allentown's Wastewater Treatment Plant for treatment. This increased flow puts an enormous strain on the plant's ability to treat all the wastewater. To reduce this strain, all municipalities that connect to the Plant are required to follow a Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) approved plan to eliminate sources of clear water. The Township has been very proactive in repairing leaks in our pipes and manholes but that is not enough to meet our goals. An inspection of residential properties will allow us to identify and help eliminate other sources of clear water into the sanitary sewer system.



Updates and notifications will be sent to all homeowners in the inspection area prior to the start of the program with all pertinent information. Specifically, the inspector will review that your down spouts, sump pump and floor drain in your basement or garage are not being discharged to the sanitary sewer system (UMT Ordinance #2007-6). The inspection will be conducted at no cost to you and will take approximately 30 minutes.

Upper Macungie Township Fire Department's are teaming up with the National Fire Protection Association® (NFPA®)—to celebrate the 100th anniversary of Fire Prevention Week™ (FPW), October 9-15, 2022.

This year's FPW campaign, "Fire won't wait. Plan your escape™", works to educate everyone about simple but important actions they can take to keep themselves and those around them safe from home fires.

"Today's homes burn faster than ever. You may have as little as two minutes (or even less time) to safely escape a home fire from the time the smoke alarm sounds. Your ability to get out of a home during a fire depends on early warning from smoke alarms and advance planning," said Lorraine Carli, vice president of Outreach and Advocacy at NFPA.

Upper Macungie's Fire Departments encourage all residents to embrace the 2022 Fire Prevention Week theme.

"It's important for everyone to plan and practice a home fire escape. Everyone needs to be prepared in advance, so that they know what to do when the smoke alarm sounds. Given that every home is different, every home fire escape plan will also be different," said Peter Christ, Director of the Bureau of Fire/Emergency Management Coordinator. "Have a plan for everyone in the home. Children, older adults, and people with disabilities may need assistance to wake up and get out. Make sure that someone will help them!"

Key home fire escape planning tips:

- Make sure your plan meets the needs of all your family members, including those with sensory or physical disabilities.
- Smoke alarms should be installed inside every sleeping room, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of your home. Smoke alarms should be interconnected so when one sounds, they all sound.
- Know at least two ways out of every room, if possible. Make sure all doors and windows open easily.
- Have an outside meeting place a safe distance from your home where everyone should meet.
- Practice your home fire drill at least twice a year with everyone in the household, including guests. Practice at least once during the day and at night.

Rest easy, Upper Macungie...our next generation of emergency response professionals is off to a great start. The Class of 2022 for our Junior Emergency Services Academy included local youngsters ages 12 to 16 and all of them graduated from the rigorous summer program with flying colors.

Conducted annually by the UMT Bureau of Fire, the UMT Police Department and Cetronia Ambulance

Corps, the Academy provides students with hands-on lifesaving skills in multiple first response disciplines and early experience for possible future careers in firefighting, law enforcement and EMS. All students earn certification in Heartsaver CPR/AED and first aid, proper use of fire extinguishers, firefighting search and rescue techniques, digital forensics, hostage negotiations and more. The free program concluded with a challenge of their new skills and a family picnic.

Keeping a portable generator on hand in case of a lengthy power outage is a great way to maintain access to electricity, but generators can also be extremely dangerous if not installed or used properly.

Before reading these tips, always read the owner's manual and instructions for your generator. Carefully follow all instructions and warnings for starting and operating the generator. Do NOT cut corners when it comes to safety.

- Portable generator users are at risk for a number of safety hazards and special precautions are required, especially in wet, icy, or snowy conditions.
- Never connect a generator to an appliance outlet. Back feeding is extremely dangerous.
- Never operate a portable generator indoors or inside an enclosed space. Even with doors and windows open, the deadly exhaust fumes can kill within minutes.
- Keep the generator 20 feet away from the house and away from vents, windows and doors. Even a small opening can allow carbon monoxide to enter the home.
- Shut the engine off and allow it to cool before refueling. Follow maintenance schedules and keep maintenance supplies on hand.
- Store fuel in containers made for fuel storage. Storage locations should be well ventilated and local laws for fuel storage followed.
- Make all electrical connections with the generator off and the circuit breaker in the off position. After connections are made, start the generator and then turn the breaker to the on position after it warms up.

Emergencies can happen unexpectedly in communities just like ours, to people just like you. Large-scale emergencies and disasters can range from inconvenient to devastating. Incidents such as hurricanes, tornados, river floods, flash floods, earthquakes, water main breaks and power outages have affected millions of people, often for days at a time.

During and following an emergency police, fire and rescue personnel may not always be able to reach you quickly, such as if trees and power lines are down or if they are overwhelmed by demand. The most important thing you can do is be able to take care of yourself and those in your care.

Be prepared...following a disaster or large-scale emergency you may be on your own and need to take care of yourself and your family. Emergency responders and relief personnel will come but it may take hours, days, for them to reach everyone!

Local, state, and federal emergency officials repeatedly stress having a disaster supply kit, which is a collection of basic items your household may need in the event of an emergency. Your kit should include at least a 72-hour supply of non-perishable food, water, and supplies, including medications, for each person and animal in your home.

Assemble your kit well in advance of an emergency. You may have to evacuate at a moment's notice and take essentials with you. You will not have time to search for the supplies you need or shop for them.

Go to www.ready.gov and click on "Make A Plan." You will find a list of simple and practical steps that you can take.

One of the most important things you can do for yourself, and your family is plan! Please consider this...we do not control when disasters strike. Your family may not be together...It may

be dark and your family is sleeping...It may be while you are at work and children are in school, daycare, etc.

What will you do? Where will you go? How will you reunite if you and your family are separated? We can learn from the experiences of individuals throughout our country who are still coping with disasters they thought "would never happen to me." By developing a family emergency plan, you and your family are better prepared and equipped to respond appropriately. If separated, you will be better prepared to safely reunite your family and loved ones during an emergency if you think ahead and communicate with others in advance.

Major disasters can overwhelm first responder agencies. The whole community can participate in programs and activities to make their families, homes, and communities safer from risks and threats.

THE BEST TIME TO GET INVOLVED IS BEFORE A DISASTER OCCURS AND THE FOLLOWING ARE A FEW WAYS:



CERT is about “Neighbors Helping Neighbors” in your own neighborhood during an emergency. CERT training is a program that educates citizens about the hazards they face in their community and trains them in lifesaving skills.

Following a disaster, these citizen-responders use their training as part of their neighborhood team to help others when professional responders are overwhelmed or not immediately available.

Keeping citizens informed.

To register for the Lehigh County's CodeRED Community Notification System log onto lehighcounty.org and click on Departments, then Emergency Management

Download the CodeRed App to your Cell Phone

The CodeRed app uses the GPS location of your mobile device. If you're traveling through a community that uses CodeRed, then you will receive their emergency alerts.

The CodeRed app and your CodeRed account are NOT connected. You must complete a separate registration for the CodeRED app.

Get the CodeRed App:

- Download the free CodeRED app, available in both the App Store for IOS devices and Google Play Store for Android devices.
- Open the CodeRED app and click on the “Register” button.
- The CodeRED app required a separate registration, but you can use the same username and password for both the CodeRED app and your CodeRED account.



ZONING, SALDO, & OFFICIAL MAP

This past June, Upper Macungie Township engaged with Michael Baker International to complete a comprehensive analysis of both its Zoning Ordinance and Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance (SALDO), as well as to create an Official Map. Although the Township has updated its ordinances many times over the years, it has become increasingly apparent that a holistic overview of these two ordinances which govern land use in the township was needed. The Township advertised a Request for Proposals and received several submissions, ultimately choosing Michael Baker International (MBI).

A Task Force has been formed which is comprised of Township Staff, Consultants, and volunteers from the township's various boards and commissions. This group will meet with MBI's professionals numerous times to review the existing Zoning and SALDO, and what changes can be implemented to create updated versions of both ordinances. The approach and methods will be grounded in the Township's 2019 Comprehensive Plan as well as the Parks, Recreation, and Open Space Plan, and the ongoing Trail Connectivity and Walkability Plan Study which is scheduled to be completed prior to the end of this year. Public input and participation is also important to the process, and two Public Workshops will be planned in the near future.

The result of MBI's work will be adopted revisions to both the Zoning and SALDO, as well as an adopted Official Map, a tool that expresses the Township's interest in the locations where future public lands and facilities such as streets, trails, parks, and open space may be planned.

ON-LOT SEWAGE MANAGEMENT UPDATE

SEWAGE SYSTEM INSPECTIONS MANDATORY IN 2022 FOR DISTRICT 1 PROPERTIES

This is an ordinance mandated by DEP to monitor the proper function of on-lot sewage systems to protect our water table and overall environment.

This directive is divided into three districts. The residents in District 3 met all requirements with no complications in 2021. **District 1 property owners are required to have their septic systems cleaned and inspected by a UMT registered pumper/hauler before December 31, 2022.** A list of registered pumper/haulers can be found on our website, uppermac.org.

Scheduled maintenance of your on-lot septic system helps reduce high costs incurred by property owners should their septic system fail but ultimately protects and maintains a healthy environment for future generations.

PREVENTING MALFUNCTIONS

Homeowners can help prevent malfunctions and ensure the long-term use of their on-lot system by doing the following:

- Conserving water and reducing waste-flow into the septic tank.
- Having the septic tank pumped every 3 years.
- Avoiding putting chemicals in the septic system.
- Not using the toilet to dispose of bulky, slowly decomposing wastes.
- Inspecting the septic tank, pipes, and drainage field annually.
- Maintaining accurate records of the septic system (design, installation, location, inspections, pumpings, malfunctions, repairs).
- Preventing run-off from downspouts, sump pumps, and paved surfaces from getting into the septic system.
- Keeping heavy vehicles, equipment, and livestock away from the septic system.
- Not planting trees and shrubs over or close to the septic system.



KEY SIGNS OF A FAILING SEPTIC SYSTEM

Signs of an on-lot system in trouble include:

- Toilet runs sluggish.
- Sewer odors in the house and/or drinking water.
- Illness, often to household visitors.
- Sponginess around septic tank, distribution box or dosing tank and absorption area.
- Surfacing raw sewage.
- Dosing pump runs constantly or not at all.
- Dosing tank alarm light is on.
- Backup of sewage into laundry tubs or other fixtures.

CURBSIDE YARD WASTE PICKUP PLEASE PUT YOUR YARD WASTE OUT THE NIGHT BEFORE THE PICKUP.

Semi-annually each year, there are fall (October) and spring (May) one-time curbside pickups of yard-waste for leaves from trees, garden residue, shrubbery trimmings, and tree trimmings. See restrictions below.

**Limbs and branches tied and bundled to a maximum of 48" x 18" x 18".
If branches and limbs are not tied & bundled, they will not be picked up.**

NO PLASTIC BAGS, STONES, LUMBER, GRASS CLIPPINGS OR ROOTS WILL BE COLLECTED!

Items improperly bagged or bundled will not be accepted. Leaf waste can be placed in open trash containers, no larger than 32 gallon capacity and less than 60 pounds. A combined maximum of six (6) bundles or containers per household will be collected.

IF YOU MISSED THE PICKUP DATE:

Yard waste may be deposited at the UMT Yard Waste Drop-off Site located near the intersection of Schantz & Grim Roads, next to the Public Works garage. Drop-off services is made available to **RESIDENTS ONLY**. Contractors and businesses are **NOT** permitted to use this facility.

IT'S TIME TO GATHER

DO

- Empty the contents of plastic bags or other containers into the gutter area to be picked up by mechanical means. Crews will NOT empty bags or containers.
- Keep all vehicles away from the area where the leaves are piled. The crews will NOT rake piles of leaves out from between parked cars or from under them.
- Place the leaves along the EDGE of the road prior to the start of pickup at 7 am on Monday of each week.

DON'T

- Don't place the leaves on the road or on private property.
- Don't place pieces of wood, steel, rocks or concrete on the leaves to hold them down. These objects will cause extensive damage to the leaf pickup units and put them out of service at a great expense of time and money to the Township and residents.
- Don't place branches, shrubbery, garbage, and building materials. These items will be left behind and it will be the responsibility of the resident for removal and disposal.
