





Implementation Funding Opportunities

Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL/ IIJA) 2021

- \$4 Billion Over the next four years to US DOT...equity, sustainability, resilience, safety emphasis
- Minimum implementation grants: Minimum \$2.5M Maximum \$30M
- Required Local Match: 20%

What are 'Complete Streets'...?

Complete Streets is an approach to planning, designing and building streets that enables safe access for all users. including pedestrians, bicyclists, motorists and transit riders of all ages and abilities. This approach also emphasizes the needs of whose needs have not been met through a traditional transportation approach, such as older adults, people living with disabilities, people who don't have access to vehicles, and Black, Native, and Hispanic or Latino/a/x communities.


Vision Zero is a strategy to eliminate all traffic fatalities and severe injuries while increasing safe, healthy, equitable mobility for all.


Probable Costs: All Improvements

Corridors + **Areas**




UMT Crash Data Map


