PLANNING REVIEWS COMPLETED FOR APRIL PC MEETING 2024:

Docket #2376–ATASBuilding Expansion–6642 Grant Way, Preliminary/Final Land Development Plan The applicant proposes an expansion of the existing manufacturing facility with an additional 53,900square foot building addition and parking lot expansion. The site is located within the Township's LI–Light Industrial Zoning District. This plan received recommendation for Preliminary/Final plan approval and associated waivers and/or deferrals.

Plan—The plan proposes an expansion of the existing site with an additional 21,278 square foot building addition and parking lot expansion. The site is located within the Township's LI—Light Industrial Zoning District. This plan received recommendation for Preliminary plan approval and associated waiver/deferral.
