Important Updates for Property Tax/ Rent Rebate Program

The Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program provides rebates on property tax or rent paid the previous year by income-eligible seniors age 65 and older, widows/widowers age 50 and older, and people with disabilities age 18 and older.

New updates to the program expand eligibility to those who might not have qualified before. The updates include:

- In 2024, the maximum rebate will increase from \$650 to \$1,000.
- In 2024, the household income limit for property tax rebates will be increased from \$35,000 to \$45,000. The household income limit for rent rebates will increase from \$15,000 to \$45,000. Half of Social Security income is excluded.
- In 2025, new income limits will be adjusted annually based on the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Real Estate & School Taxes

The Tax Collector, Tracy Hodrick, collects Upper Macungie Township real estate taxes and Parkland School District school taxes. The Tax Collector does not determine the amount of the tax or the assessment.

Office / Sitting Hours:

- The tax collector works remote. There is no permanent tax collector office at the township building.
- Upper Macungie Township does allow the tax collector to meet with taxpayers in the building located at 8330 Schantz Road, Breinigsville.
- Sitting hours will be listed on tax bills and are also available by appointment.

Tax Bills:

- UMT real estate tax bills are dated April 1 and cover the calendar year (Jan – Dec) .
- Parkland School District real estate tax bills are dated July 1 and cover the fiscal year (July – June).
- Exception tax bills are typically issued on February 1, May 1 and August 1. These bills are issued when there are increases to assessed property values (ex: new constructions, additions) that have retroactive effective dates.

Paying Taxes:

- The easiest method to pay is by check, money order or cashier's check via the mail or one of the drop boxes located both outside and inside the township building. If you are paying by cash, please have the exact amount.
- Tax payments are made payable to Tracy Hodrick, Tax Collector.
- Should you require a receipt, your options are to include your email address or a self-addressed stamped envelope with your payment or to come in person during the hours listed on your tax bill. Also, you are encouraged to include a contact phone number.
- No township employee is allowed to receive tax payments or provide a paid receipt.
- Residents who utilize online banking payments will need to create a separate "Payee" for township and school taxes.
- Returned checks will be subject to a fee of \$25 per check.

Questions & Answers

What if I write the wrong amount on my check?
IT WILL BE RETURNED TO YOU, IF A PHONE NUMBER IS
INCLUDED WITH THE PAYMENT WE WILL CALL AND LET
YOU KNOW YOUR PAYMENT CANNOT BE ACCEPTED
AND THE REASON WHY.

What if I postdate my check?

POSTDATED CHECKS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED, THEY WILL BE MAILED BACK TO THE TAXPAYER.

What if I drop off my payment after the due date? IF THE PAYMENT IS RECEIVED AFTER THE DUE DATE IT WILL ONLY BE ACCEPTED IF IT FOR THE AMOUNT CURRENTLY DUE (EX. FLAT vs DISCOUNT). PAYMENTS RECEIVED AFTER 12/31 WILL BE RETURNED.

Am I responsible to pay a late fee if my check was returned to me?

YES, THERE IS A \$25 FEE PER CHECK FOR ANY CHECK RETURNED BY YOUR BANK (EX. NON-SUFFICENT FUND, STOP PAYMENT, ACCOUNT CLOSED).

What is the best way to contact Tracy and the expected turnaround time for her to contact me?

EMAIL IS THE BEST WAY, taxcollector@uppermac.org YOU CAN ALSO LEAVE A VOICE MAIL MESSAGE (610-481-9191). WE WILL DO OUR BEST TO RETURN ALL PHONE CALLS AND EMAILS WITHIN 2 BUSINESS DAYS.

What if I did not receive a bill?

CONTACT THE TAX COLLECTOR TO REQUEST A COPY, IF YOU ARE THE OWNER OF THE PROPERTY YOU ARE STILL OBLIGATED TO PAY THE TAX BILL.

I am new to the area. Where can I find the information on what taxes I am responsible for here?

YOU CAN VISIT THE LEHIGH COUNTY ASSESSMENT WEBSITE OR CALL THE TAX COLLECTOR AND WE CAN REVIEW IT WITH YOU.





JUNIOR EMERGENCY SERVICES ACADEMY

Last year's academy week was held from July 17 to July 21st. Conducted annually by the UMT Bureau of Fire in conjunction with our three volunteer Fire Departments, UMT Police Department, and Cetronia Ambulance Corps, the Academy provides students with hands-on lifesaving skills in multiple first responder duties and early experience for future careers in Emergency Services. The free program always concludes with students demonstrating their new skills and a family style picnic. Enrollment for the 2024 Academy starts in April. FIREVORKS LEAVE THEM TO THE EXPERTS

Fireworks are a class of low explosive pyrotechnic devices used for aesthetic and entertainment purposes. They are most commonly used in fireworks displays, combining a large number of devices in an outdoor setting. Such displays are the focal point of many cultural and religious celebrations, though mismanagement could lead to fireworks accidents.

House Bill 2157 was signed into law as Act 74 of 2022. Below are just a few of the regulations involving consumer grade fireworks.

- Consumers can purchase and use "Class C" or "consumer-grade fireworks" such as firecrackers, roman candles, bottle rockets, and other similar fireworks that contain a maximum of 50 milligrams of explosive material.
- Cannot be ignited or discharged on public or private property without express permission of the property owner.
- Cannot be directed at another person.
- Cannot be discharged from or directed at a building or vehicle.
- Cannot be discharged within 150 feet of a building or vehicle regardless of whether the building or vehicle is owned by the user of the consumer fireworks.
- Municipalities may restrict use of consumer fireworks between 10 p.m. and 10 a.m. except:
 - O July 2, 3, 4 and Dec. 31 when they may be used until 1 a.m.
 - o If July 4 falls on a Tues., Wed., or Thurs. they may be used until 1 a.m. on the immediately preceding and following Friday and Saturday




AWARDS AND RECOGNITIONS


Q. What is your favorite part of being a police officer?

YARD WASTE REMOVAL GUIDELINES

For your convenience, Upper Macungie Township provides property owners with the means to properly dispose of their leaves and yard waste. We conduct curbside pickup twice a year in the spring (May) and the fall (October).



CURBSIDE YARD WASTE PICKUP PLEASE PUT YOUR YARD WASTE OUT THE NIGHT BEFORE THE PICKUP.

Semi-annually each year, there are fall (October) and spring (May) one-time curbside pickups of yard-waste for leaves from trees, garden residue, shrubbery trimmings, and tree trimmings. See restrictions below.

Limbs and branches tied and bundled to a maximum of 48" x 18" x 18". If branches and limbs are not tied & bundled, they will not be picked up.

NO PLASTIC BAGS, STONES, LUMBER, GRASS CLIPPINGS OR ROOTS WILL BE COLLECTED!

Items improperly bagged or bundled will not be accepted. Leaf waste can be placed in open trash containers, no larger than 32 gallon capacity and less than 60 pounds. A combined maximum of six (6) bundles or containers per household will be collected.

IF YOU MISSED THE PICKUP DATE:

Yard waste may be deposited at the UMT Yard Waste Drop-off Site located near the intersection of Schantz & Grim Roads, next to the Public Works garage. Drop-off services is made available to **RESIDENTS ONLY**. Contractors and businesses are **NOT** permitted to use this facility.

DROP-OFF INSTRUCTIONS:

Drop-off site located on Grim Road next to the Public Works Garage. ACCEPTABLE ITEMS: grass clippings, leaves, shrubs and small trees. All waste must be removed from bags. Please remember that grass must be separated from other yard-waste. Shrubs and small trees accepted IF they are no longer than 4 feet long and 5 inches wide.

The Township offers FREE mulch year-round as a benefit to residents. During the month of May, Township staff will be available on weekends between 9 am – 1 pm to help load.


